

THE CORRELATION OF IMPLEMENTING OUT OF SCHOOL SUSPENSION AND BOOK READING IN DISCIPLINE CASES

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The study was conducted to find out if there is a correlation between the implementation of Out of School Suspension (OSS) and book reading in discipline cases. After three months of implementing the Out of School Suspension (OSS) and submitting four Book Reviews as a sanction for unwanted behavior and non-wearing of the prescribed school uniform, the study showed that there was a high decrease of student office referrals, which means that, the new discipline policy has increased student compliance with school discipline policy and wearing of the prescribed school uniform.

Moreover, students who experienced suspension gave their reflections. They promised not to commit any violations again because according to them, they don't want to submit book reports anymore, being suspended was a nightmare, they experienced "nosebleed" in summarizing books, their parents got mad to them, their allowances were stopped, they don't want their parents to be called by the Office of Student affairs again, they just stayed at home for two days and considered reading books is "matinding parusa", being grounded "sa bahay", with no TV, no computer and doing only reading of books.
