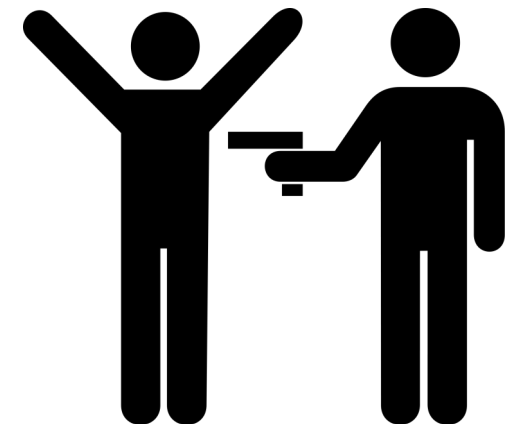

DEFINITION:

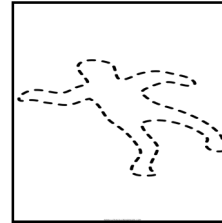
